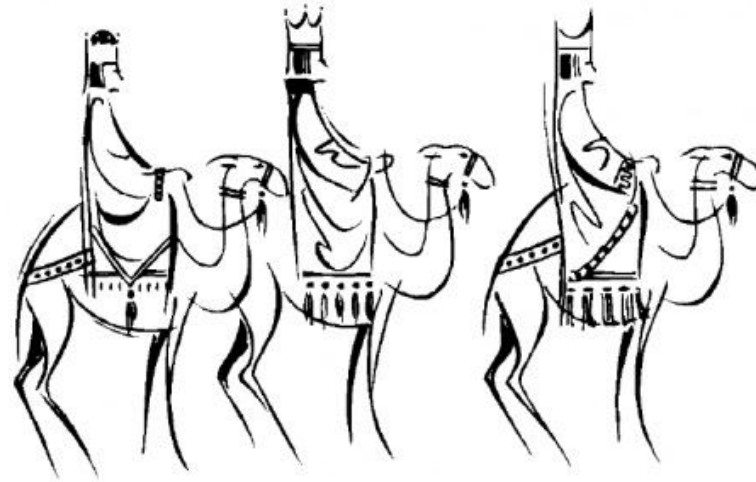

PASTOR'S PAGE

I've been keeping a journal for many years. It is something my father-in-law encouraged me to do shortly before Judith and I were married.

On the first page of my journal each year I write a couple of sentences that remind me of the shortness of life on this earth and that my real home is heaven. I use the words that one of my mentors, Pastor Maynard Force, taught me and which he wrote down similarly each January. "Perhaps this is the year that the Lord will call me home, either through my death or through his coming again. In either case, it will be a home-going." I think it is significant that on Pastor Force's tombstone he requested that these words of the apostle Paul be placed there, "For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain." Philippians 1:21

Psalms 90 was written by Moses, the man of God. After reflecting on the shortness of life he wrote a wonderful prayer that we can also make our prayer as we begin this new year. It is the same prayer that I wrote on my mother's birthday card this past November when she turned 90. "So teach us to number our days that we may get a heart of wisdom." – Psalm 90:12. It is interesting that Moses used the word, "days" and not weeks, or months or years. The implication is that God wants each day of our lives to count, to be lived for his glory.

As you may recall, in the Old Testament we read about a man named Job who went through a time of great affliction. After suffering greatly, having lost his children and all his possessions, the Lord graciously restored him and gave him the same number of children and twice as many possessions as he lost. The last verse in the book of Job records his death. It says, "And Job died, an old man and full of days." Again, it does not say, weeks, or months, or years, but "days". Each day in Job's life counted. I can just hear him praying for himself and his family, or maybe even writing in his journal, "So teach us to number our days, that we may get a heart of wisdom."

Some of you have walked through "deep water", through trials, a bit like Job, during 2011, and some of us may similarly walk through them in 2012. How good to know that through Jesus, God has enough mercy and grace for each day in this new year and, when we remember this, we can have hope, no matter how difficult our circumstances may be. The prophet Jeremiah understood this when he wrote the following words in Lamentations 3:21-24, "This I call to mind, and therefore I have hope: The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. The Lord is my portion...therefore I will hope in him."

May Jesus bless each of your days in 2012 and may you sense his mercy and steadfast love in each one of them!

Unofficial Minutes of the WELCA General Board Meeting - 12-14-11

Members present: Norma Vogt, Sandy Amundson, Marilyn Bunge, Adie Milne, Merrily Dale, Mary Lou Hansen, Donna Dreier and Eloise Hoff.

Norma called the meeting to order followed by devotions, reading a Christmas Message from Bishop Usgaard.

Sandy gave a report on the Christmas Buffet and Gift Shoppe. We sold 940 tickets. The Gift Shoppe also had a good year. A complete report will be in the Ambassador. Proceeds to be received by WELCA will be \$6,200. This is the ONLY fundraiser held by the church and ALL members are expected to participate, either by working, furnishing food or donating \$40.00 per family if not doing either. This year there was a hard time getting people to help in the dining room waiting tables. Be thinking about what you can be doing to help next year.

The agenda was adopted.

Secretary's and Treasurer's reports were accepted with a correction of the date of the next meeting.

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1) Norma reported the offering for the Thankoffering service was \$1,366, which was much higher than previous years.
- 2) World DAY of Prayer will be held at Christ Lutheran on Friday, March 2nd, 2012. Martha Circle will represent Christ Lutheran in planning the service with the women from United Methodist and St. Columban's Catholic Churches.
- 3) The mitten tree has been well supported this year. Norma took 50 items from the tree to Fillmore Central and Fillmore Co. Food shelf. There is still time to add to the tree. Mittens, scarves, caps & socks are needed.
- 4) Donna gave a report of items sent to LWR which include quilts, health kits, layettes, school kits and sewing kits as well as quilts made and presented to graduating seniors. DO DAY is held on the 3rd Wednesday of the month at 8:30 AM. Anyone is welcome to join. It is good fellowship and there is always coffee. We finish up at about 11:30 AM.

NEW BUSINESS:

- 1) Christmas gifts will be given to Pastor Dave, Amanda, Val and Dan in appreciation for all they do for us
- 2) Reorganization of the WELCA will be put off until a later date as nobody has volunteered to be the contact person to the Conference and Synodical WELCA. The current officers will continue at the present time. They are: Norma Vogt – chairperson assisted by Sandy Amundson, Eloise Hoff as secretary, Pam Ristau as treasurer, Donna Dreier and Merrily Dale as Mission Action (DO DAY). Each circle will be responsible for taking charge of any program responsibilities during the year. Motion by Donna, seconded by Mary Lou to continue in this manner and look at other options.
- 3) \$470.00 which was held back in distributions will be divided between Good Earth Village & Winona Campus Ministry, each receiving \$235.00. Both organizations are in great need. This passed on a motion from Marilyn, seconded by Eloise.
- 4) \$500.00 was set aside for the Property Team to use for sidewalk repair. This will be held in a restricted fund for that purpose until it is needed.
- 5) Amanda is working on the WELCA booklet for 2012. We will meet January 2nd to assemble the booklets at 9 AM.

Motion made by Donna and seconded by Mary Lou to adjourn the meeting.

We closed by praying the Lord's Prayer together.

ELCA YOUTH GATHERING- NEW ORLEANS 2012

We have a great group of 12 youth and 3 adult leaders from Christ Lutheran attending the 2012 Youth Gathering in New Orleans in July 2012. We will be traveling by charter bus with the 12 youth and 5 adult leaders from Greenfield Lutheran in Harmony, and a group of 17 from Central Lutheran Church in Winona.

Our Synod has nearly 1300 participants attending the Gathering. Out of the 64 ELCA Synods nationwide, we have the largest group attending! That is amazing!

Our fundraising has taken off with a great start! Your donations are greatly appreciated. We will firm up our budget once we receive our hotel assignment in January. We are currently estimating our total costs for the entire trip to be around \$13,000. At last count, we have raised \$2500 towards that goal. It has really been a pleasure working with this group and seeing the enthusiasm, commitment and participation out of 100% of those involved!

Unofficial Minutes of the December 15, 2011 meeting of Christ Lutheran Church Council

President Jon Ebner called the Council meeting to order. Council members present were Kari Mensink, Ann Ott, Erik Topness, Pam Ristau, Josh Krage, Jim Keune, and Andy Bunge. Member absent was Dan Christianson.

Motion to accept the agenda with addition under New Business of National Child Safety Council, was made by Erik Topness, seconded by Jim Keune. Motion carried.

Devotions were lead by Pastor Dave.

Secretarial report was reviewed from the November 9, 2011 meeting. Motion made by Ann Ott to accept the report, seconded by Josh Krage. Motion carried.

The Financial Secretary and Treasurer's report for November 2011 was reviewed. Total contributions for November were \$61,821.19. Total expenses in November were \$17,427.39. Net Income for November 2011 is \$44,393.80. Year to date Net Ordinary Income is \$26,753.62. Motion made by Jim Keune to accept the report subject to audit at a later date, seconded by Josh Krage. Motion carried.

Committee Reports:

Pastor's Report: Pastor Dave reported.

Participated in the Ecumenical Thanksgiving Eve service. Officiated three funerals in November and December so far. Participated in the Norwegian Buffett. Confirmation will be held at Christ Lutheran beginning in January.

Education: no meeting held in December. Kari Mensink reported.

Working on Christmas program to be held during worship on December 18, 2011. Looking for teachers for the second half of the Sunday School year.

Evangelism: no meeting held in December. Ann Ott reported.

Reviewed a Letter from Columbia and the meeting with the Columbian Synod

Property: Erik Topness reported. Meeting held 12/14/11.

Looking for 2 new members for team. Hooks for acolyte snuffers put up on the front beam so they do not need to be on the floor. Coasters available for the tables in the library to prevent carpet snagging. Danny checking on the lights outside and why they are not working. Boiler issue resolved. Will be looking into bids for a new system this spring.

Stewardship: Jim Keune reported. Meeting held 12/7/11.

Food Shelf donations for the month of October totaled 23 pounds. The Joyful Giving campaign was successful with \$12, 270 given so far. Will put a report in the Ambassador and give special attention to this in a church service in January.

Reviewed November financials. With the special offering, we are close to breaking even. The funds from the Shirley Hanning IRA of \$45,000 were used to repay the capital fund \$35,000 and the remaining balance to be used as determined at a later date. Discussed ways to encourage people to give and ways to cut expenses. Discussed meeting with Evangelism and Worship teams to talk about how we can improve worship attendance and participation in other activities. It is the team's opinion that if we get people more involved, they will be more likely to give. Discussed Synod Benevolence. Need to consider making payments on our benevolence now that we are closer to a balanced budget. Discussed having a Synod rep explain how our funds are used and what our congregation should expect from the Synod. Future meeting dates discussed. Will have January meeting, but after that will plan to meet only when we have items which require team action.

Worship: Andy Bunge reported. Meeting held 12/7/11.

Sunday School program for 12/18/11 was presented by Kari Mensink and Paul Schmidt. Outlined a rough draft for the service. Bell Choir is up and running. Discussion held if there is a way to mic the bells. Marilyn received a \$500 estimate to build a new electric circuit board for the chimes. Reviewed altar guild schedule presented by Jeanette. Cynthia and Marilyn presented the final draft of the wedding song guidelines. Pastor Dave and Andy presented the plan to address Matt Olsen's absence for his Sr. choir director's duties. A formal letter written by Pastor Dave and approved by Council President, Jon Ebner and Andy Bunge was sent to Matt asking him to respond to our concerns.

Youth: No December meeting held. Josh Krage reported.

Youth Gathering planning committee up and running well. Fundraising efforts have risen over \$1,500 so far. November event was rock climbing at Eagle Bluff. Need to get more youth attending. Plan to focus activities for younger youth as well.

1) Transition team. Five congregational members have agreed to be members of the Transition Team. They will be contacted to form their first meeting by Council President in the future.
